5 min	ŚELOQ I, EĆOST TŦE WELU,ĆISTENEK I, S,ÁLEW (Circle and introduce instructors and elder) Who has met May before? Does anyone know what wool is? Who has seen a Cowichan sweater before? Does anyone have family members who knit?	
35 Mins	 SĆA EŢ May (May's work): Talk about some of the work May has done with wool, and learning about of some of the tools used are used in wool work. Demonstrate how to make a pom-pom. Distribute appropriate amount of wool to students. Help the students with stay on track with directions from May, and have fun while making pom-poms. 	
5 min	ŚELOQ: What did you learn about today? What was your favourite part?
